Two New Smallholder Certifications in Brazil

A <u>smallholder group harvesting macaúba palm earned RSB certification in Brazil</u>'s Minas Gerais state. The certification includes two family farmers associations as well as Unidade de Beneficiamento de Coco Macaúba (UBCM) a small cooperative that processes macaúba fruits collected by local communities.

ASSOBARI (Associação dos Fornecedores de Cana da Região de Bariri) is the <u>first organization of sugar cane producers in Brazil to earn the RSB certification</u>. The RSB certification is for the production of sugarcane by 62

farmers, most of them smallholders, covering approximately 1,860 hectares of sugar cane plantations. They produce around 148,000 metric tonnes of sugar cane per year.

A third group - <u>Socicana</u>, a sugar cane association in Brazil's São Paulo state, is in the process of being RSB certified.

The three certifications are part of the RSB smallholder program, made possible by the Boeing Corporate Citizenship Program and the Swiss government, which aims to improve the living conditions of small farmers and promote sustainable practices based on the RSB standard and seeking market for certified products.

Africa's First Biofuel Flights on RSB-Certified Feedstock

South African Airways (SAA) celebrated Africa's first sustainable biofuel flight in July. The flight from Johannesburg to Cape Town, used biojet fuel produced from Sunchem's nicotine-free tobacco plant Solaris, refined by AltAir Fuels, and supplied by SkyNRG. Sunchem and SkyNRG are both RSB certified, and AltAir is in the process of



RSB certification. Boeing has supported the certification of smallholder farmers producing Solaris.

NRDC Recommends Airlines Source Only RSB Certified Biofuels

The Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC)'s 2016 Aviation Scorecard report recommends that airlines should make public commitments to source only RSB certified aviation biofuels, and communicate this to fuel and feedstock producers. All Top 6 Leading Airlines listed in the report have contracts for delivering RSB-certified aviation biofuels. These include Air France/KLM, SAS, British Airways, SAA, United, and Cathay Pacific which are looking for and preferring RSB certified fuel. The report also offers good news for airlines already purchasing RSB certified fuel, as NRDC offered more points and higher sustainability ratings for those airlines using RSB certified fuel than any other certification system in the world.



Franklin Baker First Food Ingredient Producer to Earn RSB Certification



Franklin Baker Company, Philippines earned RSB certification for the growing, harvesting and supply of coconut products from farms located in the Mindanao Island, Philippines. Their products include desiccated coconut, virgin coconut oil, and coconut flour.

"RSB certification provides numerous benefits to any manufacturing organisation," said Jerry Lorenzo, Franklin Baker's President and CEO. "The strength of RSB for

Welcome to New RSB Member: Ubrabio

RSB recently welcomed <u>Brazilian Biodiesel and Biojetfuel Union</u> (<u>Ubrabio</u>), as RSB's newest member. RSB is also now a member of Ubrabio as both organisations have signed a joint membership agreement to work together towards the common goal of sustainable biomaterials. Ubrabio is based in Brazil and will be part of RSB's <u>Chamber 7: Intergovernmental Organizations (IGOs)</u>, governments, and research/academic institutions.



RSB recently <u>announced its re-recognition by the European Commission</u>. In order to receive public support or count towards mandatory national renewable energy targets, biofuels and bioliquids used in the EU must comply with the EU's sustainability criteria. 
RSB Nominated as Technical Advisor to UN ICAO/ICSA's Alternative Fuels Task Force



RSB has been nominated by <u>WWF</u> to act as a technical adviser to the <u>International Coalition for Sustainable Aviation (ICSA)</u> in the <u>Alternative Fuels Task Force (AFTF)</u> of the <u>UN International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO)</u>. RSB will bring its expertise to ensure that any sustainability criteria for aviation biofuels developed in ICAO fully deliver against all three pillars of sustainability in a way that is practical for airlines seeking to use sustainable alternative fuels. <u>Elena Schmidt</u> will represent the RSB and attend upcoming meetings on 18 to 21 October.

ICAO 2016 Environmental Report Published

An RSB authored article "Beyond CO2" was published in Chapter 4 of ICAO's Environmental Report for 2016 called "On Board A Sustainable Future." The article looks at the importance of strong sustainability standards, the role of sustainable biofuels in achieving ICAO's climate goals, smallholder impacts, indirect land use issues, and the UN Sustainable Energy for All Initiative (SE4AII).



RSB Welcomes Arianna Baldo as Southern Africa Regional Representative



Arianna Baldo joined <u>RSB's Secretariat</u> team this summer to lead and coordinate the uptake of the RSB standard in Southern Africa and ensure the effective implementation of RSB field projects and stakeholder engagement activities. Low Carbon Fuel Project Achieves Breakthrough as LanzaTech Produces Jet Fuel from Waste Gases for Virgin Atlantic

News of Lanzatech and Virgin Airlines spread quickly when it was announced that for the first time ever, 1,500 US gallons of jet fuel has been produced from 'Lanzanol' - LanzaTech's low carbon ethanol, producing the world's first jet fuel derived from waste industrial gases from steel mills, via fermentation process. The Lanzanol was produced in China at the RSB certified Shougang demonstration facility.

SkyNRG, KLM and AltAir Sign Three-year Off-take Agreement

KLM has signed off-take agreement to purchase sustainable jet fuel for all flights departing from Los Angeles, making it part of their day to day business. The fuel, produced by AltAir Fuels and supplied by RSB certified SkyNRG, is made from used cooking oil and delivered via the airport's hydrant system.
